

Interjurisdictional Practice Certificate (IPC)[®]

Quick Guide

The Interjurisdictional Practice Certificate:

- Is a prerequisite for obtaining the Temporary Authority to Practice certificate (TAP[®]) issued by the PSYPACT[®] Commission to practice psychology interjurisdictionally under the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (PSYPACT).
- Application processing fee is \$200.00 and is non-refundable.
- Processing time is 2-3 weeks.
- Can be accessed in your credentials bank at PSYPRO.org.

ASPPB[®] IPC Application Checklist

- ☐ **Licensure** – Must have a current, active psychology license, based on a doctoral psychology degree in at least one participating PSYPACT state and have no disciplinary action listed on any license.
- ☐ **Education** – Educational requirements can be met by one of six pathways based on a doctoral degree in Psychology. Official doctoral transcripts must be sent to ASPPB directly from the university or its clearing house to transcripts@asppb.org or P.O. Box 849 Tyrone, GA. 30290.
- ☐ **EPPP[®] Examination** – Successful completion of the EPPP with a score that meets or exceeds the established ASPPB recommended passing score.
- ☐ **Renewal** – To remain active the IPC must be renewed annually.
